

The "McSweeny Chalice", Echoes of A Dark Time and a Warning for Today

At St. Joseph's Seminary at Dunwoodie in Yonkers, NY there exists a beautiful relic where Irish history, art, and faith intersect. Known as the "McSweeny Chalice," the beautiful chalice is intricately engraved with Celtic patterns framing a depiction of the crucifixion. On the base is a Latin inscription which translated reads "Pray for the soul of Daniel Swyne, brutality of this period is that it produced 17 martyrs who were later beatified.

After a brief period of toleration during the Restoration, the brutal penal laws were introduced after the Battle of the Boyne to eliminate Catholicism from Ireland entirely. Writing in the

(Sweeny) priest of the diocese of Lismore, who had me made in the year 1640". For over 300 years this Chalice was passed down through continuous generations of priests in the McSweeny family, eventually crossing the Atlantic where it was donated to the seminary by Monsignor Patrick F. McSweeny.

However, behind the beauty of the Chalice and the touching story of family, there is a secret. In a piece of engineering rivaling the beauty of the artwork, the chalice was designed to be broken down into three parts: cup, stem, and base. The stem then fits into the base, which inverted fits into the cup.

The Chalice was designed this way so that it could be easily concealed, for to be a Catholic priest in 17th and 18th century Ireland was a crime punishable by transportation or even death. Since the reign of Henry the VIII, to be a Catholic in Ireland was to be doubly viewed

as an enemy. The conquests of Cromwell reduced Ireland's population by 50% and dispossessed those who remained so that Cromwell's soldiers and British colonists could possess the most productive farmlands.

Even these depredations were not enough, and a new front was opened to attack Ireland's soul. Catholicism was criminalized and for a priest to offer a Mass or for a Catholic to attend one was to court death or transportation to Barbados. Yet Masses continued to be said at "mass rocks", makeshift altars constructed of boulders in remote areas. A testament to the



19th century, Professor William Lecky, himself a Protestant, described the object of these penal laws as "To deprive Catholics of all civil life, to reduce them to a condition of extreme, brutal ignorance, to disassociate them from the soil ... and to expatriate the race." Catholic education was outlawed, yet hundreds of young men left Ireland to study in Europe and then risked prison and death to return to Ireland and keep the flickering light of faith alive. Catholic priests were offered the bribe of a comfortable lifetime income if they converted to become ministers in the Church of England; few took the offer. Finally, in 1709 the British Government required all priests to take the Oath of Abjuration, swearing that they renounced that the Holy Eucharist was the body and blood of Christ and the divinity of the Blessed Mother; in short to denounce their faith.

The majority of priests refused and returned to living clandestine lives perpetually on the run; saying secrets Masses and living in hiding in rough underground burrows. Not content with reducing the Catholic clergy to living like animals, the British government hunted them as such. In 1709 bounties of £20 for a priest and £50 for a Bishop at were placed on their heads as if they were wolves; this at a time when a skilled carpenter would earn £15 pounds for a year's work. These priests and their congregations maintained the faith despite all the attempts of an autocratic empire to crush it.
